Summary of 2013 Pupil survey

At the end of last half term we carried out our annual pupil survey. We do this every year to help us with setting priorities and monitor pupils' views and attitudes towards school work and school life.

Changes since the previous survey:

The pupil questionnaire now includes reception classes for the first time. 2011/12 had 214 responses= 89% (no reception) 2013 survey had 278 responses = 90% (including reception). The neutral, 50:50, option was dropped from the vote this year for being too unclear.

As were the additional comments section (on reflection, this was a mistake and will be reinstated next year).

Positive Responses:

There seems to be a rise in areas through last year's neutral views being translated almost completely to positives in:

- pupil's engagement
- academic guidance, knowing when work is good, how to improve, what to do when stuck
- the children's perception about parental views about the school
- homework

Negative Responses:

There is clearly more work to be done for the small percentage of pupils who feel only negative about:

- academic guidance, for when they are stuck or how to improve .
- working with a partner
- working alone
- children being helped to be kind

We are speaking directly with a few children who have expressed particular concerns and are looking at ways to improve things for them.




