safety and water that is clean. Disease ridden and murky, the water is giving people diarrhoea and, to make it worse, the lack of privacy is disturbing and very embarrassing. The fear and panic is immense as the flood still owns the town, killing anything in its way.'

We debated topics such as 'There should be more women in Parliament' to which our chair acknowledged that currently 'To be a women in parliament you either need a gem for a granny or enough money for a nanny'. Shalin and Hadi took the floor to debate on the topic of 'More sports in school'. They suggested that although it is important to be fit and healthy, jobs in the future will be much more reliant on technology than physical fitness. Ruwayda stood to tell the house that she believed 'Creativity in schools is just as important as academic work and that academic work should give us the skills to express our creativity'. Finally, Zaynab put forward our class question based on our rainforest topic 'Should Britain play a larger part in protecting the global environment?' They had a wonderful day. 

They closely observed a variety of landscape paintings by famous artists and then a set of landscape photographs by well known photographers. By considering the use of colour, the main features in each image, and the mood created, they
