<u>Fantastic learning in</u>

Thorgil the Viking come to visit Year 3 last week. He taught the children about artefacts. trade, types of vikings and even threw in a story about Thor! It was very exciting and then the had a go at making their own shields!



Then they learned about viking runes and how each symbol corresponded to English. They were able to write their own letters using runes, with the English translation beneath. They topped it all off by smearing the paper with coffee and tea to give the paper an authentic feel - they really did look like they were from the past!



In literacy they have been reading 'Wolves' by Emily Gravett. They role-played the story in their groups and freeze-framed key moments. They have just learned about homophones and how these can be used in contrast to an illustration to create humour. They are now writing letters to one of the characters using a polite, yet sarcastic tone, peppered with key writing features such as structure, adjectives and adverbs.
