Year 5 have been tackling some 'weighty' concepts as part of their topic 'Mission to Mars'. They have been learning about gravity, weight and mass and the relationship between them. Using the equation 'mass (kg) x gravity (N/kg) = weight (N)' they worked out how much a 2kg mass would weigh on every single planet in the solar system! In addition, they wrote a summary explaining what they know about the new concepts they have been learning, and even became professors, students and observers in an activity to help them consolidate what they have been learning. Not satisfied with keeping this knowledge to themselves, they also put on a class assembly to share
