This week 7 children from year 5 and 6 attended a Career's conference at the British Library. There were 22 other schools there and we heard from a wide range of people about how they came to have such interesting careers. All of them talked about loving their job and how they had been determined to get to do what they were doing, even if they changed their minds about what their "dream" job was to be. We heard from, internet entrepreneurs (one who was only 14), a war reporter and filmmaker, a slam poet, an illustrator and artist, jewellery designers, and an engineer who made rockets.

"The conference was about people who have had successful careers. I learned that having a job is very important. Some of the people who had good careers knew at the start what they wanted to do, some of them didn't and some changed their minds along the way. One woman who worked at Moshi Monsters thought, to start with, that her children should not even go on the site and she ended up working there and loves it.


