### Message from the head

And finally...... SATS 2014: I wanted to share with you all the headlines of our fantastic SATs results:

- 90% of our children achieved level 4 in combined reading and maths
- 37% of our children achieved level 5 in combined reading and maths
- 39% achieved Level 5 in Reading
- 85% of our children achieved level 4 and above in Spelling & Grammar, with 63% getting level 5 or above, and 12% getting a level 6.
- 95% of our children achieved Level 4 and above in Maths

• 59% achieved Level 5 in Maths and 17% achieved level 6 We are very proud and would like to acknowledge every teacher who has played their part.

I hope everyone will read as much as possible over the summer holiday. We have 3 great libraries nearby – Kentish Town, John Barnes and Swiss Cottage and they have great programs free throughout the summer.

Remember: "Every book will teach you something - whether it is something about the world you live in, about you as a person, or just about the kind of books you do or don't enjoy; Books give you access to emotions and experiences you've never had - so, you can go places you've never gone, and be people you'll never be; And reading makes you smarter"




