Fundraising—please help!

Many of us can take the health of our children for granted. For some in our community, living daily with a life threatening illness or disorder is a way of life. In the Brecknock community we have a little girl who has just such a life threatening illness that



requires her to be fed from a pack she must carry with her at all times. She cannot eat or drink and gets all of her food through a tube into her heart. She has spent a large proportion of her life in hospital and often has to return to hospital for invasive treatments. This year, she started nursery—something at one point the family thought she'd never be able to do. This has allowed her to have a semblance of a 'normal' child's experience which she has loved. One activity this family has never been able to do with her because of the feeding pack she has to carry is go swimming. We would like the Brecknock community to come together to raise some money to be able to buy the family a special 'dry suit' that will allow them to take their daughter swimming for the very first time. Next Friday we are holding the Friday cake sale for this end and on top of that, Henny our fantastic nursery teacher, is going to be running the Beachy Head Marathon over half term and is collecting sponsorship money for this cause. If you would like to sponsor Henny, make a donation or provide any cakes etc. for the cake sale please do so via the school office. The dry suit costs £300 and we know the generous Brecknock Community can come together and make this happen for the family.


