Widening the pavement campaign:

Our plan to raise awareness of the significant danger outside the Nursery and Reception gate is moving forward. Our School Council wrote a letter to Camden asking them to consider widening the pavement and making Cliff Villas into a one way street. They pointed out how congested it is and how dangerous it is when so many cars are going up and down. There is just no room for people to pass each other—particularly with bikes, pushchairs, scooters etc. Another idea proposed is that Cliff Villas could be closed at the beginning and end of the day. We are encouraging as many parents as possible to be involved and are thinking of ways to get a petition started. Please see the letter from school council on our website (on the front page). We will keep you updated on the website. I am so proud of school council and the brilliant work they do, led by Tiggy, in raising awareness of issues and finding solutions to problems. We are a very democratic school and our pupil voice is strong.







