Nepal Earthquake—Tea Sale and 'Bring a Pound Day' Friday 8th May



On Saturday Nepal was hit by a devastating earthquake, its worst in over 80 years. More than 5000 people are reportedly dead and 50,000 more injured. The numbers of dead and injured are expected to be much higher as thousands lie trapped in the rubble. Thousands of children are in danger. As a UNICEF Rights Respecting School we would like to support the UNICEF appeal to raise funds to help those most affected by this tragedy and provide life-saving emergency assistance. Next Friday we are going to be holding our usual Friday Tea Sale in aid of this appeal. We would also like to join with UNICEF's 'Bring-a-Pound' Day. So next Friday, 8th May, we would encourage anyone who can to donate items to the Tea Sale and/or come along after school and buy a snack. Also, if children could bring £1, or any spare change on this day—whatever amount you can spare, no matter how small, for a collection. Just £55 can provide 5 families with clean drinking water.
