At Brecknock we believe strongly in children learning to cycle as a vital life skill. We only wish we could offer this course to more children. The Camden Cycle Safety team run a number of courses after school and in the holidays at various locations throughout Camden. There are after school cycling projects on 4 days each week during term and in the holidays. There are bikes and training provided for toddlers, children and adults. This service is free for all users. The training includes complete beginners and also includes on road training for those aged 9 and over. Sessions start at 3.45 and finish at 5.30.
