Acland Burghley school in Tufnell Park will be open to the public this Saturday from 10am to 6pm as part of the Open House event. The biggest celebration of architecture of its kind in London, Open House lets people look round architecturally

important buildings. Acland Burghley was given a Grade 2 listing in March for its increasingly rare Brutalist look. The building, which is 50 years old this year, was built by Howell, Killick Patridge and Amis - a famous practice who also built the Young Vic theatre on London's South Bank.
