### **Mull's Super Science**

In Mull this week they conducted a very interesting science experiment in class. They began by asking the question - 'Why do leaves lose their colour during the Autumn?' They discussed in great detail the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees and the different seasons. Here is how they tested their experiment:

- 1) They gathered some different coloured autumn leaves.
- 2) They broke them up into small pieces and popped them into three different jars organised by colour. They crushed them up with a spoon.
- 3) They poured in Isopropyl- A mild acid which will help to break down the colours. Then they gently swished it.
- 4) They wrapped cling film over the top.
- 5) They placed all three jars into a basin with nearly boiling water poured in.
- 6) They waited for 30 minutes and then removed the cling film and stuck in a coffee filter to absorb any of the colour that they had removed.

The next morning they found some amazing results and recorded them in their science books. Take a look at some of their pictures.









# **Family Literacy in Reception**

It was so lovely to see so many parents at the Reception literacy morning last week. Parents saw a short phonics session and a shared guided reading session and then joined the children in Literacy activities around the book The Gingerbread Man. During the same week the children also got to make their own gingerbread men which tasted delicious.









### The road to nowhere... and then we found somewhere!

The intrepid explorers of Cuba and Jamaica (Year 5) discovered what Lee Valley Park had to offer this week! Using compasses and maps they were able to follow coordinates to get clues, well, most of them! Just like the great explorers of our time we realised that 'getting lost' is part of the explorer life... As Ernest Shackleton declared, "Difficulties are just things to overcome, after all."









### **Sumatra make Roman Jewellery**

Sumatra have been learning about the Roman empire this term and got to spend time designing, making and painting some Roman jewellery out of clay. Various types of jewellery were worn by different genders and social classes in Ancient Rome, and were used both for aesthetic purposes and to communicate social messages of status and wealth.
