Echoes Across the Century

You may of heard that some of our Year 5 children have been involved in a very exciting project called "Echoes Across the Century". It was organised by the Livery Schools Link and is funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. Children from a number of schools across London have been finding out about how people from various trades were involved behind the scenes in World War 1 and have worked with an established artist to create pieces of art based on this. Brecknock worked with the Cooks and the Bakers Companies. This is an important project, unique and highly regarded, and we are delighted to have been involved.

Brecknock children worked jointly with Highbury Fields Secondary School, cooked

lunch in a World War 1 field kitchen and then created pieces of art based on their experience and what they found out about life in the First World War.

The work will be exhibited at Highbury Fields School in the first instance (some of you were lucky enough to see the



exhibition at the 'Private View' this week!) and then all the work will be gathered together for a major three month exhibition, open to the public, in the Guildhall in the City of London between 31st March and 16th July. Reading Eggs and Mathletics


