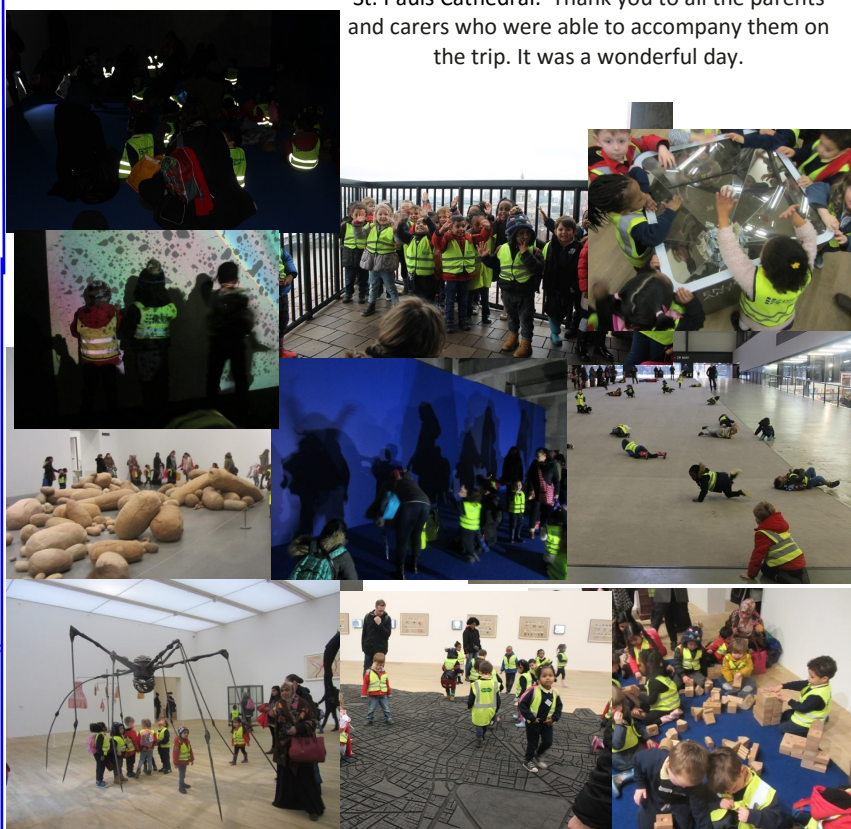

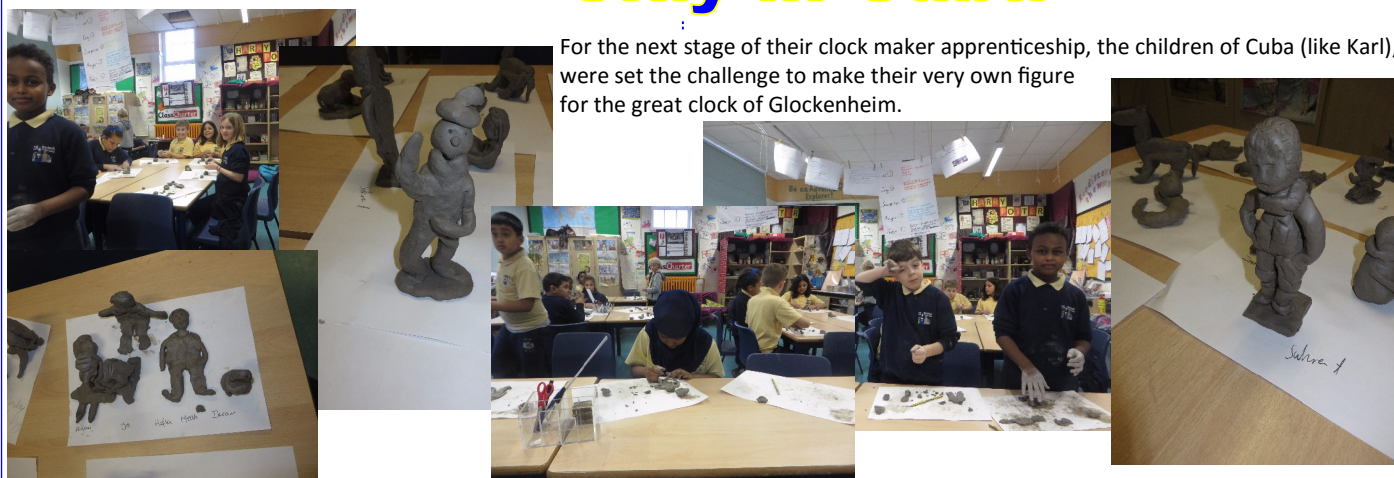
## Exciting news!
