Camden Cycle Skills

Camden offers cycle training for children, adults and families.

Our next two-day holiday courses for children are on Mon-Tue, 12-13, and Wed-Thu, 14-15 February. The morning sessions are for complete beginners. The afternoon sessions for children who can already ride.

Courses for adults are held every second weekend. There are sessions for people who have never cycled and for those who want refresher training.

The training is delivered at Haverstock School, NW3. There are bikes and helmets free to borrow.

Camden also offers 1:2:1 training for adults and young adults who would like to cycle on-road. You will need your own bike for this training.

Last week, Year 3 raised **£91**. This money is for the class to spend as they wish and goes towards trips and minor expenses.



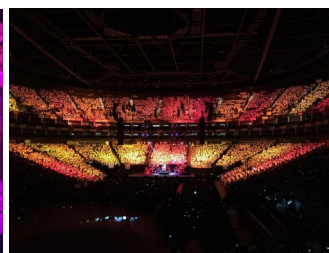
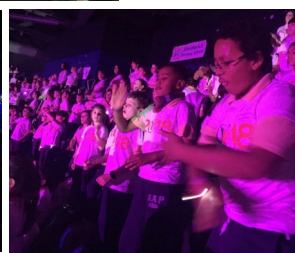
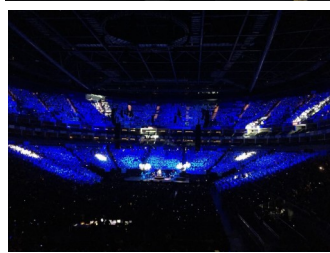


Choir at Young Voices 2018
