Science Boffins STEM Week Launch Show

Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Week is finally here, and what a great start we've had. Eva from the Science Boffins took us through an epic journey of chemistry, biology and physics.

We looked at optical illusions and how our eyes can deceive us, used chemical reactions create toothpaste for Eva's friend Ollie The Elephant, aerodynamics and so much more! Barry, we hope that Eva has reimbursed you for your £10 note that was set on fire.



Year 5 at the Francis Crick Institute

To celebrate STEM week, Year 5 were lucky enough to spend the day at the Francis Crick Institute to learn all about atoms. The children put on their lab coats and goggles then transformed into scientists! They did an experiment separating water from hydrogen peroxide. They then did a series of tests on different substances looking at whether they were soluble/insoluble, pH levels and the presence of gasses!

Bones

Year 3 have been learning all about bones this week. They measured their arm span, looking at bone development and were taught by real scientists on how to keep their bones healthy.



Year 4 Home Learning

Year Four have been working extremely hard at home on their topic, Ethical Fashion. Many of the children designed their own t-shirts using fabric paints and lots of glitter! Others had a look at where their clothes were made, this included Bangladesh and China. The children had the opportunity to share their work with the rest of the class, and they all had lots of questions.



Year 6 at the Natural History Museum

For their topic, Who Am I?, Year 6 visited the Natural History Museum on a mission to unpick Evolution. The children were set the challenge to discover what animals, plants and conditional environments were present along different time scales within the evolution of our planet.

They were then shown the fossil of an animal and told it lived in a mossy area. They had to think about how is features helped it live within its environment – why would it have webbed feet? They were then set on the task to match the evolutionary changes of the creature to the changes of its environment and soon realised ... it was a horse! They discovered that creatures adapt to fit their environment and that evolution happens through inheritance.





Hello?

This week, Year 4 have been investigating how sound travels. They made telephones using plastic cups and string and went to the roof to try them out. After some testing, they realised that the string needed to be pulled tight otherwise they couldn't hear each other. They discovered if the string was loose the sound was unable to travel. Having the string tort meant that the vibrations were able to pass along it.

Life Under the Scope

Year 6 have been looking at life under the scope. They couldn't believe how terrifying ordinary things such as insects, and even the skin on their hands, looked when enlarged under the microscope.



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
