You may write me down in history, With your bitter, twisted lies, You may trod me in the dirt But still, like dust, I'll rise.

Does my sassiness upset you? Why are you beset with gloom? 'Cause I walk like I've got oil wells Pumping in my living room?

You may shoot me with your words, You may cut me with your eyes, You may kill me with your hatefulness, But still, like air, I'll rise. x3

Out of the huts of history's shame

Up from a past that's rooted in pain

Leaving behind nights of terror and fear

Into a daybreak that's wondrously clear

Bringing the gifts that my ancestors gave, I am the dream and the hope of the slave. I rise, I rise, I rise.

This poem is linked to the theme of 'change'. There is a change in tone, there is a change in the way that Maya Angelou makes you think about her. 





WELL DONE RUBY!
