

In Year 3 we are learning about 'Vikings'. We are also working on a book called 'Beowulf - Usborne'

Over this term complete at least one of these homework activities.

Think carefully about which ones you want to do, and remember to create a real quality piece of work to share with the rest of the class!

 <p>Any piece of artwork that the children produce for home learning needs to have a piece of writing to go with it that explains what they did or what they learnt.</p>	<p>We are learning about Viking weapons, armour and shields. Create one of your own at home. Using a range of materials children can create a piece of Viking armour or weaponry.</p>	<p>Design and make your own Viking jewellery. Use a range of materials to make a replica piece of Viking jewellery.</p>	<p>Vikings travelled on long ships – create your own Viking long ship. Collect natural or manmade materials to make a Viking long ship. You could use twigs or wood for the bottom of the ship and material for the sail.</p>
	<p>Create a fun PowerPoint presentation that gives children lots of information about what life was like during the period of the Vikings. You may want to think about how a presentation must be informative and entertaining. Your audience must have fun whilst learning!</p>	<p>Using your computer, research the Viking Alphabet and write some Viking riddles or questions to share with the class.</p>	<p>Using Microsoft Word and a map, create your very own Viking poster showing the route the Vikings journeyed and the many destinations they travelled too.</p>
	<p>Write a myth based on our class text Beowulf. In Beowulf our main character meets many mythical beasts and encounters several battles. Try and make sure your myth, include many twists and turns as well as descriptions of characters.</p>	<p>Create an information book about life during the time of the Vikings. You might like to use headings like 'Viking long ships', 'Viking weapons' and 'Viking family life'.</p>	<p>Write a story set in Viking Britain. Think about what your characters will do each day, what will happen? Will something go wrong? How will it be solved?</p>
