WORLD BOOK DAY NEWS

Read all about it! Let's frolic in the festivities of a day to celebrate books.

On Monday 4th, KS1 will have a visit from Frann Preston Gannon, author of the award winning, 'The Journey Home, among other books. She will deliver an assembly followed by a workshop for Years 1 & 2. On Thursday 7th, KS2 will hear author Sarah Holding talk about her trilogy, Seabean. These exciting books are set on the island of St. Kilda. The protagonist, Alice, comes across a black cube with incredible powers. Alice and her friends go on an adventure to try and save our planet. Sarah will be in the middle hall from 3:15 - 3:30 to sign books and talk about her novels.

On March 7th, pupils are asked to come to school dressed as their favourite book character. Pupils will be interviewed about their favourite character from a book and a prize will be awarded to the best costume and explanation about the character. Homemade costumes are best and pupils should ideally bring a copy of the book their favourite character is from.

To help make everyone's costume authentic, pupils will have the opportunity to make parts of their costume in school, with the help of Book Aid. This is a fantastic charity that has raised money for libraries and teachers to teach less fortunate people how to read, in over 25 countries. They were eventually given just one clue—it has to have a loop! They successfully made circuits with lamps, buzzers and even a propeller (motor)!










