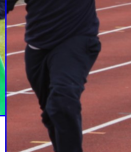
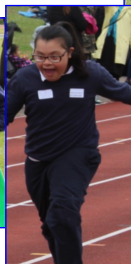
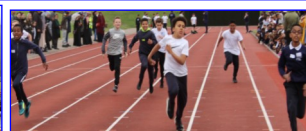
SPORTS DAY 2019!

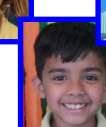
Amirah's Story
