The Latin Programme

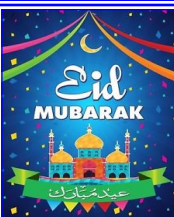

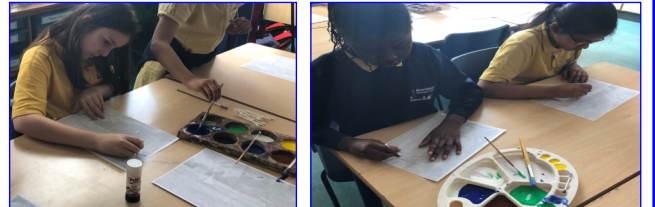
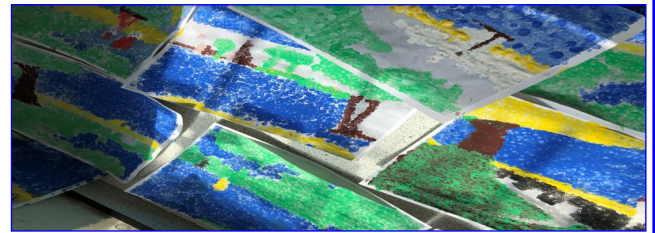


Did you know that Kew Gardens is home to more than 30,000 different kinds of plants!
