

**In Year 3 we are learning about *Saving the Planet!* We will also be working on a book called *'Jemmy Button'* and a story called *'The Great Kapok Tree'***

	<p><b>We will be learning about animals that live in the rainforest. Create a collage or painting of your favourite rainforest animal in its habitat.</b></p> <p>You may want to think about the outline of the animal first, and then add features, colour and texture.</p>	<p><b>We will learn about rainforest tribes, and many wear traditional jewellery. Design and make your own tribal necklace.</b></p> <p>You may want to use recycled materials like bottle tops, items you can find outside like feathers and seeds, or anything you have at home.</p>	<p><b>Rainforests can be found all across the world! Create a world map showing where rainforests are located.</b></p> <p>You may want to think about making your map interactive, 3D or even use collage.</p>
	<p><b>We will be learning about climate change and deforestation. Create a fun PowerPoint presentation that gives an understanding of what deforestation is and how we can prevent it!</b></p> <p>You may want to think about how a presentation must be informative and entertaining. Your audience must have fun whilst learning!</p>	<p><b>We will learn about how education and recycling can help the deforestation problem. Use software such as publisher, word or paint to present this as a poster.</b></p> <p>You may want to think about what we learnt in the debate and how recycling can help reduce paper waste.</p>	<p><b>We will learn about different animals and how they can sort and classify them. Use a branching database to create one of your own.</b></p>
	<p>In the story of <i>The Great Kapok Tree</i> the animals speak to the small man to try to persuade him not to cut down the tree. Write your own persuasive argument about why we should not cut down the rainforest – use examples from the story to help you.</p>	<p><b>We are reading <i>The Great Kapok Tree</i> and will learn about deforestation through the book. Write an imaginative diary entry from the perspective of one of the animals affected.</b></p> <p>You may want to include details of what life was like before the loggers and farmers arrived, and what happened when they were there. Describe sensory details and feelings.</p>	<p>In the story of <i>The Great Kapok Tree</i> the small man in the story encounters lots of different animals such as bees and boa constrictors. Select your favourite animal from the book and present a fact file. Make sure you think about where the animal lives, what it eats and what it looks like.</p>
