You have until Friday 3rd July - your time starts NOW!




You should have received an email on Monday regarding us signing up to the brilliant communications app - **Parent Hub.**





This is a completely **FREE** app to download and use and will allow you to get instant notifications and information straight to your phone from both


the school and your class teacher. You can receive whole school or whole class messages, as well as direct private messages regarding your child's individual brilliant work.


It is quite straight forward to sign up and to use, but should you need help, please follow these instructions.











At same point in the next few weeks we will be using Parent Hub to send out the newsletters on a weekly basis, rather than through Parent Pay.






A True Role Model - Henry's Star of The Week
