Do you remember the names of these 3D shapes? Answer these questions with your grown up:


What is the name of the shape?

Communication and Language

With a grown-up, play a memory shopping game. Take it in turns to say things you would like to buy in a shop. Try to remember all of the items each person says. How many items can you remember?

Person 1: "I went to the shops and bought a banana"

Person 2: "I went to the shops and bought a banana and a teddy bear"

Person 1: "I went to the shops and bought a banana, a teddy bear and ..."

Being Imaginative

Set up a pretend shop in your house. What will you sell? How much does it cost?

Role play being the shop assistant and the customer with your grown up or someone in your house. You could use real coins to pay for your shopping.
