


## Fantastic Foundation Subject Activities

<p>Draw a map of the world, label the continents and oceans. (North America, South America, Africa, Europe, Asia, Oceania, Antarctica,)</p> 	<p>From Trash to Treasure!! Use any old boxes and bottles to create something new! Add a splash of colour with pens or paint. What will you make?</p> 	<p>Create a 3d map of the UK, label the countries and capital cities. Perhaps you could use paper mache</p> 	<p>Make a poster or something similar to teach others about way we can care for the environment, remember to think about recycling, saving water etc</p> 	<p>Make your own endangered animal top trump card. Remember to include words like recycle, reuse, water, ice, sea, plastic, environment</p>	<p>Make a poster to put up near where you live about what goes in the recycling bin and what goes in a rubbish bin</p> 	<p>Make your own fingerprint <a href="#">minibeast garden</a></p> 	<p>The next time you are out and about in a park, stop and look at the flowers that you see. Can you identify them? Draw them and the try and make a book about local plants in your area</p>	<p>Design your own reusable water bottle. What would it look like? What materials would you use?</p>								
<p>Create a music playlist of songs that make you feel happy. Include the artist and song title where possible and prepare to share some of your favourites with your class in our next zoom meeting</p> 	<p>Create your very own musical instrument. You could use an old water bottle and some rice to make a shaker. <a href="#">Click here for some more ideas</a></p> 	<p>After the Great Fire, King Charles II asked for a new map of London to be drawn. Draw a map of your neighbourhood or somewhere you know well. Remember to include important buildings and label them.</p>	<p>Design and create a Lonely Beast mask. You could make more masks for friends or family members and have your own party, like at the end of the story.</p> 	<p>The Lonely Beast travelled all the way to the city to try to find other beasts. At first people were scared of him and ran away, but eventually he won them round. As the Beast, write a guide book for other beasts who may want to travel to the city.</p>								

<p>The Lonely Beast loves baking cakes. Do you know any delicious cake recipes? Make a recipe card or two for the beast, so he can try some delicious new treats.</p> 	<p>Keep a diary of the different birds you spot from your window or from the same spot outside your building over one week. You could draw the different birds and keep a tally of how many you spot each day. Make some notes about any interesting behaviour you observe.</p>	<p>Can you make your own zoo? Try using cardboard, paints, paper mache, glue, lollipop sticks, playdough, anything you like to build the zoo of your dreams. Label it clearly and be ready to present it to the class in a zoom chat. What animals do you have? what are their habitats like? Etc.</p> 	<p>Have a go at making your own <a href="#">Origami Butterfly</a>. This is a really popular Japanese art which uses small bits of paper to make things!</p> 	<p>Find some time to play Charades with the people that you live with! Together, write a list of characters onto paper, fold them and put them into a pot. Taking turns, take one piece of paper out to reveal a character and then act out that character! Think about what they would say / do / behave like!</p>
<p>With an adult, have a look and see what ingredients you have in your cupboards. Then use this <a href="#">Recipe Search</a> to find ingredients that you can use to make something special at home!</p> 	<p>Make your own board game. Draw a simple track or path on paper and number the spaces. You could make this a Science / Maths game where the players must answer correctly to move on to the next space! Use dice and small toys to play the game!</p> 	<p>Making a Family Tree - You may need help from an adult with this task! You can use either just on screen/paper or go 3D! Add photos/ draw pictures and stories about each person.</p> 	<p>Secret challenge - make cards with ideas of things you have to get other people to do, e.g. sing a song. Everyone chooses a card in secret. Then, you have to try to get someone to do what's on your card in the course of the day, without them knowing.</p>	<p>Vinegar experiment! Clean coins using vinegar. Place the coins into a shallow dish and cover with vinegar. After a while, empty out the vinegar and give the coins a rinse to see how much shinier they are!</p> 
<p>Chromatography experiment For this activity, put felt-tip dots on a piece of kitchen roll, dip it in water and watch the colours split!</p> 	<p>Indoor Gardening! Put seeds or the ends of things you've eaten (such as carrot tops) into water and see if you can grow them</p> 	<p>Communication Write an email or a letter to a friend or family member. Maybe you could attach a drawing or photo?</p> 	<p>Home Cinema Watch a TV show or video together. As you watch it, write questions to talk about afterwards. What happened in the show?</p> 	<p>Make invisible ink using lemon juice and a few drops of water. Write a message on paper by dipping a paintbrush in the lemon juice mixture and write a secret message. Place the message on a radiator, near a lightbulb or in the sun to reveal the hidden message.</p>

<p>Create an old-looking treasure map or letter by using tea or coffee to stain a piece of paper. You might want to link it to a story you have read or a topic from school!</p> 	<p>Make a time capsule.</p> <p>What would you put inside a box to open in one, five or ten years time? Think about things that are important to you and why you would like to put them in.</p> 	<p>Create some wrapping paper, a pattern or a picture by dipping cut potatoes or carrots into paint and pressing them onto paper. Even better if there is an upcoming birthday in your household to use it!</p> 	<p>Put a little washing-up liquid and water on a plate and mix in the centre. Put straws onto the plate and see who can blow the biggest bubble. Don't forget to ask for permission first. You can always try and use your Deep Breathing Strategies that you have practised in school!</p> 	<p>Imagine the Queen came to visit your home!</p> <p>Ask someone at home to pretend to be the queen and everyone responds as if they are.</p> <p>How would you prepare for her visit?</p> 
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
