
COVID-19

Online payments and ParentHub App

We would like parents and carers to use our online **Parent Pay payment service**. This service allows you to pay for your child's school meals, trips and after school clubs online. If you haven't signed up for this free service, please ask a member of the office team to issue you with new account details. **The school office runs a cashless payment system**. No cash will be accepted in the main office and all payments must be completed **online via the Parent Pay or via debit or credit card** in the main reception.



Currently, we are sending out letters and updates through Parent Pay. However, very soon we will be switching to our new App ParentHub. If you have not done so already, it is essential that you download the app in order to ensure you receive all school communications. We will send out an email this week with instructions reminding you how to set it up.

Currently 50% of parents in the school have signed up for the service but we need this to be 100%! Thank you for your support with this.

Breakfast Club and After-School Clubs

Breakfast Club

We are able to offer a limited number of paid places in our Breakfast Club. Under the current guidance they will be placed in bubbles. The fee will be £2 per day £1.50 for those entitled to Free School Meals. The drop off is from 7.45am. All children attending breakfast club should access the school via the main gate.
