

What do Christians believe about forgiveness – link to Easter and other stories such as Zaccheus.

WHAT COMES NEXT

Year 3 - Christians believe in the Trinity—there is 1 God with 3



WHAT YOU SHOULD ALREADY KNOW

Christians believe in God.

Christians believe in the story of creation and that Jesus was the son of God.

Christian: someone who believes in God.

God: Christians believe he is the creator of the world.

Jesus: the son of God.

Bible: Christian Holy Book.

New Testament: the part of the Bible written after Jesus was born.

Lord: see God.

Mary: mother of God the son (Jesus).

Joseph: Mary's husband

Forgiveness: to no longer feel angry towards someone when they have done something wrong.

Parable: a story that Jesus told in the Bible.

Zaccheus: a tax collector mentioned in the New Testament.

Easter: the day Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead.

Lent: the 40 day period leading up to Easter.

Good Friday: the day Jesus died.

Disciple/Apostle: the followers of Jesus.

Judas: the disciple who betrayed Jesus.

KEY LEARNING

To know that Jesus taught people to be loving, kind and forgiving because that is what God is like.

To know the parable (story) of Zaccheus from the Bible and to understand that Jesus used this story to teach forgiveness.

To know the story of the Unmerciful Servant (Matthew 18:23-24) and link it to forgiveness in the Lord's prayer.

To understand that Christians believe in a God that forgives them and that they are reminded of that in the Lord's prayer.

To understand that Christians believe Jesus died for the salvation of humans and so they could be forgiven for their sins.

To know the Easter story - the Last Supper, the Trial of Jesus, his death on the cross and his resurrection.

VOCABULARY

God: the creator of the world.

Old Testament: the part of the Bible before Jesus was born.

Torah: the law of God as revealed to Moses—the first 5 books of the Hebrew Bible.

Creation: the story from the Bible that explains how the world was made by God.

Genesis: the part of the Bible that explains the story of creation.

Moses: A Hebrew prophet who led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt.

Prophet: a person who speaks the word of God.

Hebrew: a member of the people that lived in Israel/Palestine a long time ago.

Synagogue: the holy place where Jewish people worship God.

Judaism Year 2

MAIN IDEA

What Jewish people believe about the Torah and why it is so important to them.



WHAT CAME BEFORE

That Jewish people believe in one God who created the universe.

WHAT COMES NEXT

Year 6: Comparing different religions special books and special celebrations.

WHAT YOU SHOULD ALREADY KNOW

Children should know that Jewish people believe in one god who created the universe.

They should know that Jewish people believe in the Covenant that they are special people chosen by God.

KEY LEARNING

To know that Torah means 'teaching' and is the most important part of the Jewish scriptures.

To know that it contains the first 5 books of the Hebrew Bible.

To know that it teaches Jews what God is like and how they should live their lives.

To know that one day a week Jews observe the Sabbath—they rest, have a meal on Friday evening with their family.

To know how special the Torah is a for Jews and that it is read each week in the synagogue.

To know that followers of Judaism believe that God dictated the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai after Moses led the people away from Egyptian slavery.

VOCABULARY

Muslim: People who follow or practice Islam.

Mosque: place where Muslim's worship.

Allah: the one and only God in Islam.

Muhammad: chief prophet of God.

Quran/Koran: the Islamic Holy Book as dictated to Muhammad by God.

Mecca: where Muhammad was born.

Creation: Muslim's believe that Allah created the universe.

Iman: faith.

Pillars of Islam: the five obligations every Muslim must satisfy in order to live a good life.

Salah: second Pillar of Islam. It is the physical, mental and spiritual act of worship which is observed 5 times a day.

Islam Year 2

MAIN IDEA

To understand the importance of Iman (faith) exploring prayer and the Mosque and it's importance for followers of Islam.

WHAT CAME BEFORE

Year 1: Main beliefs of Islam - Allah - the God and Allah created the universe. They believe that Muhammad is the messenger of God.

WHAT COMES NEXT

Year 5: the Five Pillars of Islam



WHAT YOU SHOULD ALREADY KNOW

Children will know that Muslims believe in one God—Allah who created the world.
They will know there is one God and Muhammad is his messenger.

KEY LEARNING

To explore and understand the importance of artefacts such as prayer mats, mosques and the Quran.

To understand the importance of Salah - prayer - for Muslims. And to know that Muslims pray five times a day.

To know that Muslim's worship in a Mosque and that the Holy book they used is called the Quran.

To build on their understanding of the importance of the belief that Muhammad is the Messenger of God (Year 1).

To recall the first revelation Muhammad received - The Night of Power:

- Muhammad is in a cave.
- He sees the Angel Gabriel.
- He is told to recite (Iqra) a book held in front of him.
- Muhammad states he can not read.
- On the third instruction he can read the message.
