
It has been a really productive week at Brecknock. We are very proud of the children, who are learning well and enjoying reconnecting with their friends.

Covid Update

Thank you for your co-operation at the school gates. We are working with Camden Inspectors to ensure that we practice social distancing and keep ourselves and others safe. This includes all adults wearing masks and following the one-way systems. It is important that parents do not linger to speak to each other on the school grounds or outside the school. Following advice from Camden, we have made some changes to the pick-up arrangements at the KS2 gate (Please see Page 7). Please ensure that you wait for the time slot to enter the playground and follow the one-way system to pick up your child. It is really important to follow the procedures, so that we keep Brecknock families and staff safe. Thank you again for your support.



The school is currently in consultation with Camden, regarding the distribution of Lateral Flow Tests to families for home use. We will keep you posted regarding this service. Implementation of statutory Relationships Education and Health Education

Prior to lockdown we held face to face year group consultation meetings to update you on the implementation of **statutory Relationships Education and Health Education.** Due to Covid and national lockdowns the Government announced the date for implementation had moved from **Autumn term 2020 to Summer term 2021** when we will begin to teach the new requirements.

Face to face consultations were over a year ago so we have published all the key information about the changes on the school website. This includes the <u>topics</u> that need to be covered in Relationships and Health Education by the end of primary school.

Since the initial parent consultation we have developed a **draft Relationships Education policy** based on the Camden exemplar, for consultation with you. We are also in consultation with the governors and the school councillors; a representation of children from across the school. The draft policy can be found here. Please read and complete the survey by the 31st March 2021. **We will collate your responses and review the policy in light of your feedback.**

Connecting With Others


Good relationships are important for your mental wellbeing. They can:

There are lots of things you could try to help build stronger and closer relationships:


- If possible, take time each day to be with your family, for example, try arranging a fixed time to eat dinner together

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Nursery have been reading 'The Gingerbread Man'. The children have enjoyed retelling this story in their own words, making sure the gingerbread men have enough buttons on them to match the numeral that they rolled on the dice. They have also enjoyed helping to find his 'lost' buttons out of a big tray of ginger using tweezers to strengthen the muscles in our fingers and hands. They were also challenged to use their problem solving and lateral thinking skills, by encouraging them to think about other ways the gingerbread man could have travelled across the river to avoid being eaten by the fox. Khalid suggested a bridge and then built his creation using the wooden blocks. Nevar suggested travelling across the river in a plane and Nancy suggested travelling across the river in a boat. They both then used reclaimed materials to create their designs.










Amazing work this week Nursery!

Year one started a new topic in art this week, printing. They have been looking at artists who have used printing to make pictures and had a go at printing using objects they found in the classroom. They used lots of different objects including carrots and Lego bricks to make their own prints. They have also been working on their number bonds to 20 this week.



Reception have had lots of fun exploring their topic 'plants and growth' this week. They planted cress seeds, wrote instructions and discussed the many different parts of a plant.









Year 2 have been continuing their work on 'The Lonely Beast'. This week they created their own amazing newspaper headlines.

Continuing from last week's work Year 5 used our designs to model our sculptures. The children enjoyed using clay and creating masterpieces inspired by Henry Moore. Next week will be inspired by a different sculptor - Alberto Giacometti!









Year 5 have been continuing to learn about forces, this week they have been looking at air resistance. To investigate the effects of air resistance, the children have been making parachutes. Later this week we will test the parachutes to see whether materials, shape or size will make a difference to the parachutes flight.











Year 6




















New afternoon pickup/home time rules and guidance

Firstly, thank you for your continued support and patience as we try to operate school drop-offs and collections in the safest way possible. We continue to reflect and develop systems that ensure the safety of parents/carers, children and staff at home time collection and have decided to make a small number of changes to the KS2 collection system. Earlier this week, you received messages regarding safe distancing and the wearing of face masks; thank you for ensuring that these measures taking place and for adhering to the signage around the school regarding this.

From this week we will be re-implementing a one way system in the playground with strict guidance when collecting your children. Please see the attached map and guidance/rules below:

- We will ensure that all children from KS2 will be in their positions before parents are able to access the premises. Parents who collect from multiple Year groups will be able to collect their children in one circuit of the one way system.
- Children that walk home on their own will be released first.
- Parents will then be invited to come and pick up their children in year group order. (Year 6, Year 5, Year 4, Year 3)

There will be staff in the playground to help with this system. So if you have any questions, please do ask a member of staff.

Please remember that parents are currently not permitted to walk around to the school office from the back playground. If you need the assistance of the school office, please walk around the around building to the Cliff Villa entrance and buzz for the school office.

Once again we thank you for your continued cooperation in these challenging times.

I am getting in touch from the walking and cycling charity, Sustrans; the organisation behind the annual Big Pedal, the UK's biggest active travel school challenge.

The Big Pedal will be running this year from 19 - 30 April, and Schools will compete to see who can get the greatest numbers of pupils, parents, guardians and staff making active travel choices and cycling, walking, wheeling and scooting to school.

The booking system for Parents' Evening will open on Monday 15th March and will close on Monday 22nd March at noon.


It is the same system we used back in November, but this time the meetings will also take place through <u>school cloud</u>, as a video conference.

You will be able to book a 10 minute appointment with your child's teacher(s). If you have multiple children, you will be able to pick appointments that will not clash with the other appointment(s).


