





Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a fantastic start to the new academic year at Brecknock over the past few days, with children settling happily into their new classes and returning to good learning habits. Our priority remains responding to the loss of learning for all children during the lockdowns. Whilst continuing to offer a broad and progressive curriculum, we will keep focusing **on filling the gaps in children's learning and helping them to catch up**. We hope you were able to attend our virtual **Meet the Team** meetings with class teachers this week. This letter gives further important and detailed information regarding the year ahead and this term's learning.

**This year, Brecknock** will be focusing on improving their oracy skills (speaking, listening and vocabulary) to support their learning across the curriculum. We will be promoting the right to be heard, return to the Brecknock values and learn about local and global issues that matter to us. Through our whole school theme: **'A Time to Talk; A Time Change'** we will learn about the **17 Sustainable Development Goals** which aim to ensure a quality education for all, fight inequalities and fix climate change. ### Rights Respecting Children

As a **Gold Rights Respecting school**, we consistently focus on the rights of the child and how these help us to develop an understanding of respect and empathy for others. At the start of this term, every class has created their class charter, underpinned by the Brecknock school values.



In class, the children are praised for excellent work, participation and following the class charter and whole school values. Children are rewarded with stickers linked to the school value they have demonstrated. These values are celebrated during our weekly special achievement assemblies.



## Learning in Year 5

Please reference the **curriculum leaflet** that gives you an overview of the learning that will be taking place this term in your child's year group.

Through our geography topic this term, the children will be learning about biomes, where they will expand their world knowledge of different climates, their habitats and different vegetation. In history, we will be looking at Ancient Greece where we will hopefully have an exciting trip to the British Museum. Using our knowledge of Ancient Greek life, through DT we will learn skills in pottery making, creating our very own Greek inspired pots. In Art, we will look at the eccentric Salvador Dali and his work in surrealism. Lots of exciting learning to come in year 5!

All classes will use **Brecknock Timelines** and **Knowledge Mats** to support children to learn, remember and recall key facts across all subjects.

## Trips

We are delighted to be able to plan and take children on a range of educational trips once again. All trips will be risk assessed and following current guidelines. This term we will be going on trips in the local area of Camden. We will send you more details shortly!

## Attendance and Punctuality


We understand that reaching 100% daily attendance is challenging at this time, we will be celebrating good attendance and time-keeping behaviour in our weekly star of the week assemblies. **We encourage you to monitor your child's attendance using Parent Hub to ensure their attendance remains excellent. Please ensure you download the Parent Hub App to access your child's profile.**

We send the majority of the schools communications via email, including the newsletter which is sent every Thursday and uploaded to the school website. Letters for trips, dinner money and anything in relation to finance is sent via your ParentPay account. We also send short messages that we need to communicate with you quickly through the Parent Hub app.

The school **gates open at 8:50am** in order for lessons to **start at 9.00am**. **Please ensure you follow the one way systems in place to allow for social distancing.**

## Home Learning

<b>Homework</b>	<b>Homework at Brecknock will be given through Google Classroom.</b> Children have been set up in their <b>new Google Classrooms for 2021-22 and homework will be set online.</b> Login details will be the same as last year but with a new class code which is:
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	<p><b>5M:</b> df5gb6q</p> <p><b>5U:</b> kdh4tox</p> <p>Children have been re-issued their login details at school.</p> <p>This year, we will be incorporating new online learning strategies, such as quizzes, into the home learning. These will help to embed previously taught core skills and to support children to retain knowledge from across the curriculum. Homework books are available if children prefer to do their homework in this way but we would encourage the use of Google Classroom. Quizzes will be <b>set on Wednesday</b> and must be <b>returned to class, or completed online, by Monday morning</b>.</p> <p><b>Differentiated spelling tests</b> will take place <b>on Mondays</b>.</p> <p>We also expect children to <b>read every day at home and to fill out their Reading Records alongside their parents/carers</b>.</p>
<p><b>Reading</b></p>	<p><b>Parental and guardian support</b> is hugely important for developing reading skills, confidence and understanding. Even if children are independent readers, we still encourage parents to read with them or listen to them and discuss the books they are reading.</p> <p>Children need to read at home for <b>at least 20 minutes a day</b> and complete a short daily reflection ('<i>I enjoyed this book because...</i>' '<i>It was funny when...</i>' or alternatively an adult can write the comment for them) in their reading records.</p> <p>Children's reading records and current reading book should still be brought to school every day as they are sometimes used, and referred to, in lessons.</p>
<p><b>Fluency in maths</b></p> 	<p>Knowing number facts is an important tool to enable your child to feel confident in maths. <b>Revising number facts, including times tables</b>, is an easy way to support your child's progress in mathematics and we encourage children to revise them regularly.</p> <p>Through their weekly homework, children will be given strategies and activities to support them. Children will also be encouraged to <b>login into online maths resources</b> such as '<b>Times Table Rockstars</b>', '<b>My Maths</b>' '<b>Hegarty Maths</b>' or '<b>Doodle Maths</b>'. <b>Their login details for specific website resources will be sent home</b>.</p> <p><b>MOT Certificates are awarded</b> to children in Celebration Assemblies when they have successfully mastered the number facts relevant to their learning and personal targets (e.g. times tables).</p>
<p><b>New words</b></p>	<p><b>Direct vocabulary teaching takes place every day</b>. On a Friday, children choose one of their new words to wear on a sticker. We encourage you to speak to your child about their chosen word each week as this will help them to deepen their understanding of the word and to develop their oracy skills.</p>

		
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Homework, spelling books, reading books and reading records should be kept in a book bag as these are used/referred to regularly in class.

## PE

PE will take place every **Tuesday and Thursday**. Children **will not be changing for PE** so please ensure they wear appropriate clothes for physical activity on these days, including trainers. Please note, we have and will **continue to do a Daily Mile**, so it is important that children wear appropriate footwear daily.
