Last year, our attendance was slightly higher than the previous year at 92% but still significantly below our 95% attendance target. School attendance is mandatory. Please be aware that:

- It is the schools' responsibility to record attendance and follow up absence
- Schools and local authorities may issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct if a child is absent from school.
