Kentish Town Heroes: Who helps us at home? - Celebrations and Festivals

Communication and Language

Children will make the sounds of animals and other things when adults share books with them using puppets and props to encourage listening and responding.

Children will help adults with jobs to excite their curiosity by finding things the adult asks for eg: find the shells, find the snails, find the hats.

Children will find the correct thing that has been asked for.

Physical Development

PE: Negotiate space safely playing racing and chasing games. Explore movements, including agility, balance and coordination.

Fine motor skills: Hold a chunky pen or crayon and explore the marks they can make. Use rolling pins, cutters and play with dough.

Gross motor skills: Climb up a ladder or onto a sofa. Fit themselves into spaces like tunnels and dens and move around in them.



Personal, social and emotional development

Self Regulation- Express preferences and make some decisions with visuals to support.

Managing self: Choosing toys by themselves. Show the need for going to the toilet. Wash and dry hands themselves.

Relationships: Play by themselves or with other children. Find an adult they know, when needed.



Literacy

Key texts: What Do You Celebrate? Holidays and Festivals Around the World, by Whitney Stewart, The Colour Monster Goes to School by Anna Llenas, My World, Your World, by Melanie Walsh, All Are Welcome by Alexandra Penfold

Outcomes: mark making, explore a range of different materials - clay, paints, brushes, shells



Mathematics

Number: Sort out objects so that all the same ones are together.

Numerical patterns: Building towers and long lines with bricks. Complete inset puzzles and jigsaws.

Understanding the World

Understanding self: Who am I and who are my family? How am I similar and different to others? How do we celebrate in our different cultures?

Understanding the world: Exploring natural materials and textures, indoors and outside.

Talking positively about appearances and differences: Celebrate and value cultural, religious and community events and experiences.

Expressive arts and design

Music: The very first musical performance celebrating the origin of Christmas where the children will be learning festive singing and will discover pitch and rhythm for the very first time with actions.
