HUMANITIES - GEOGRAPHY United Islands: Geographical study of the UK and local area fieldwork

Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas. Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries. To use aerial photographs to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map and use key compass points; and use and construct basic symbols in a key. To be able to use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

ENGLISH

Key texts: Finn MacCool and the Giant's Causeway by John Dougherty, The Big Book of the UK by Imogen Russel Williams, Inside the Villains by Clotilde Perrin

Outcomes: Folktale (to entertain), fact file (to inform), character description (to entertain).



MATHS

Mastering Number: Focus on odd and even numbers. Composition of 7 and 9. Look at the composition of 'teen' numbers as 10 and a bit. Compare numbers within 20.

Addition and Subtraction: Fluently add and subtract within 10 - using precise addition and subtraction strategies.

Addition and Subtraction of 2-digit numbers: Use part-part-whole representation. Knowledge of 'making ten' to solve addition and subtraction of one-digit and two-digit numbers. Partition two-digit numbers in different ways. Use knowledge of adding and subtracting multiples to solve problems.

Multiplication and Division: Introduction to Multiplication (1) - Understand grouping and units. Represent and show equal and unequal groups. Use knowledge of 2, 5 and 10 times tables to solve problems. Understand zero as a factor. Double two-digit factors.

SCIENCE: Uses of everyday materials

Identify and compare the suitability of different materials. Learn how materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

COMPUTING - DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Learn to recognise that different devices can be used to capture photographs and gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. Use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

THROW, PREPARE, CATCH: Master basic movements including throwing and catching and to develop coordination and apply these in a range of activities.

AGILITY, BALANCE, COORDINATION: Master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and coordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities.

RE: Concept – special journeys -Journeys in the Christmas stories.

PSHE - Personal Social Health Economic: Living in the Wider world: Black History Season - equality, identifying racism and what it means to be anti-racist.

Health and Wellbeing: Identify healthy snack options, food groups, the benefits of eating five portions of fruit and vegetables.

Drugs Education: learning about medicines and how to stay safe around them.

ART & DESIGN and DESIGN TECHNOLOGY:

Children will learn about where food comes from. They will talk about food groups and make a healthy meal using foods that are grown in the UK.

MUSIC: Sing songs regularly with a pitch range of do-so with increasing vocal control. Sing songs with a small pitch range, pitching accurately. Prepare for a musical Christmas performance.
