





Fewer of those who have traditionally enjoyed reading, such as girls and those aged 8 to 11, now say they enjoy it.








Young voices are at the heart of the campaign, with World Book Day's selection of 2024 £1 national books chosen with the help of our children 2 years ago! The books are coming to us!







Representing our community through our texts







The report's key points:

- 7% of the children's books published in the UK over the last 3 years feature characters from diverse backgrounds.
- The number of children's books published in the UK over three years (2017-19) featuring characters from a Black, Asian or minority ethnic background has increased to 10% in 2019, rising from 4% in 2017, 7% in 2018 to 10% in 2019, according to CLPE.
- CLPE's research shows that characters from a Black, Asian or minority ethnic background remain significantly underrepresented in comparison to the UK primary school population where 33.5% of children are from a minority ethnic background.
